About the wood...

Established in 2002-03, Skuff Wood in Burnsall has extended an area of ancient semi-natural woodland by planting 600 native trees.

The woodland comprises species of ash, rowan, sessile oak, bird cherry, hawthorn, hazel and holly.

The trees were planted in tree guards and stock proof fencing was erected to prevent grazing damage to the saplings.

How to get there...

Skuff Wood is located less than half a mile north of Burnsall on a west facing slope overlooking the River Wharfe.

You can access the wood via a footpath between Burnsall Bridge and Skuff Road, and which runs along the top edge of the site.

Alternatively, there are two small lay-bys on Skuff Road in which you can park to view the wood.

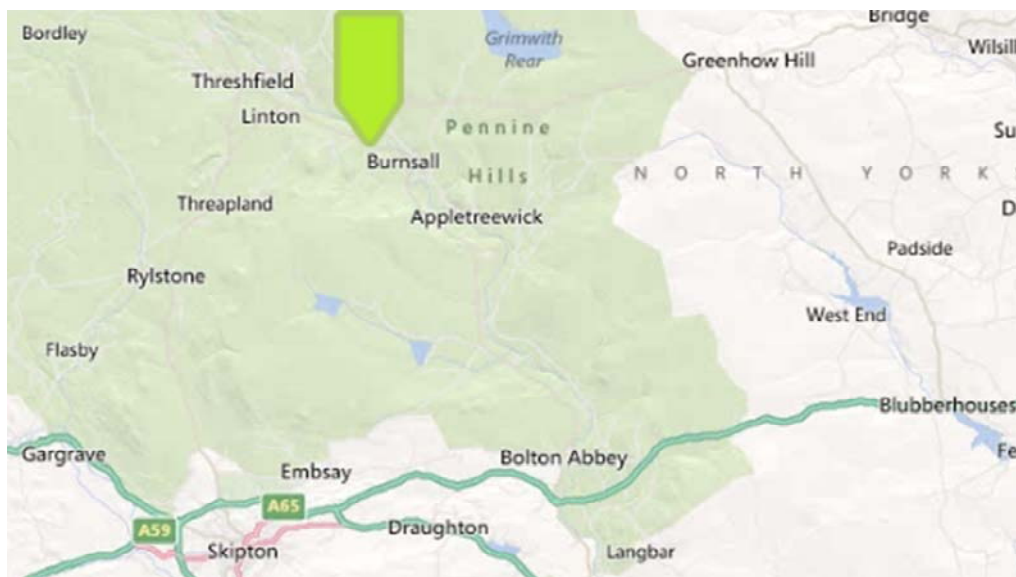
