

Low Branthwaites



About the wood...

Low Branthwaites is short distance from the historical and bustling book town of Sedbergh, in the shadow of the Howgills, with stunning views all round.

The woodland is part of beautiful B&B and guesthouse run by Anna and Darren who are passionate about the area and creating new woodland habitat that can be enjoyed by everyone.

2,200 native broadleaf trees have been planted in total and include: Hazel, Elder, Rowan, Blackthorn, Downy Birch, Holly, Bird Cherry, Hawthorn, Crab apple, White Beam, Spindle and English walnut.

All saplings have been planted with individual tree guards to protect them from harsh weather conditions and damage caused by rabbits. The site has been fenced from livestock.

How to get there...

Low Branthwaites is only a few miles from the the centre of Sedbergh.

Follow the A684 from Sedbergh (towards Hawes) and cross the River Rawthey. Low Branthwaites is less than two miles on your right hand side and is marked by a sign.

There is parking further up the A684 at a large layby which offers great views of the Howgills.

PLEASE NOTE: The woodland itself is situated on private land but does have a public right of way which leads to it from the access track to Low Branthwaites B&B. To visit the woodland itself call in at Low Branthwaites. There is no parking (except on official YDMT woodland open days).

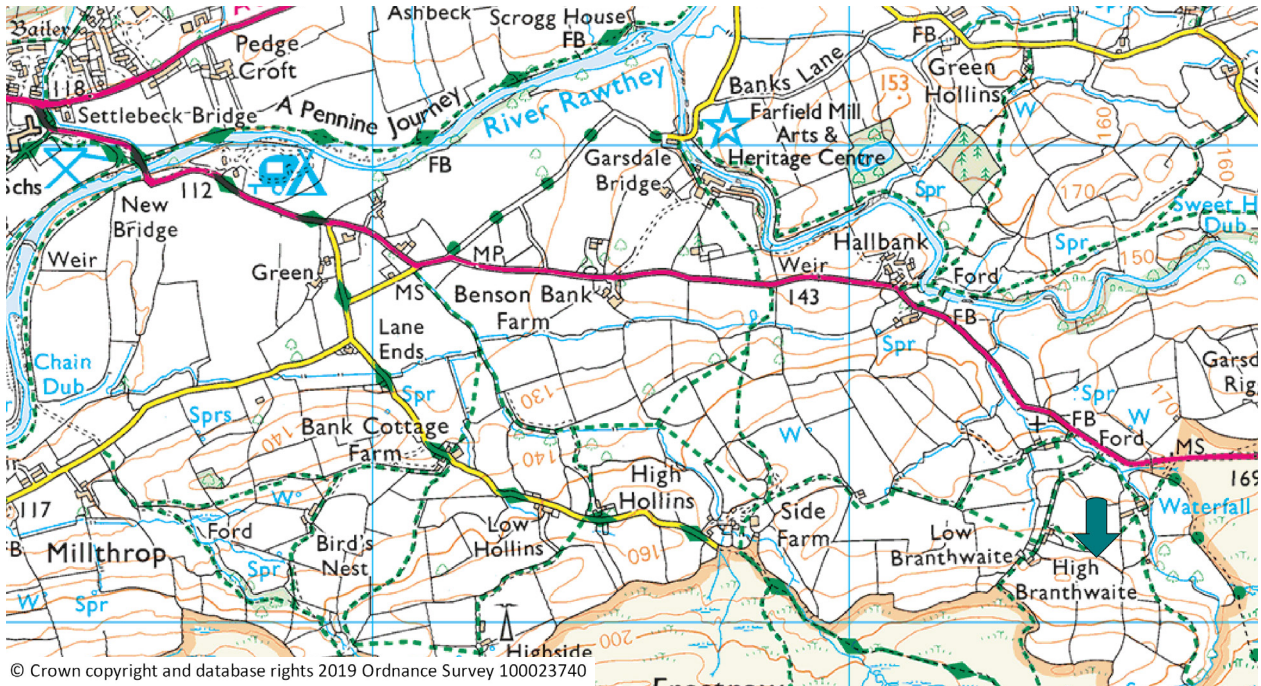
Yorkshire Dales Millennium Trust
