Leeds Building Society

What started as a one year agreement with Leeds Building Society (LBS) has developed into a long-term strategic partnership, delivering against our mutual objectives to support people and planet.

Working with the product team, our partnership is empowering LBS customers to take action for the environment. Our first campaign enabled customers to grow a tree alongside their savings – with one tree planted for every new child's savings account opened. The campaign has expanded to engage customers with other conservation initiatives.

10,720 trees planted with every new children's savings account

Customers can now support wildflower meadows, helping to bring this priority habitat back from the brink of extinction in the UK.

Staff engagement is another important aspect of the partnership. Responsible Business Lead at LBS, Wendy Carter said: "Our work with YDMT connects to several areas of our responsible business strategy, helping us towards our aim of supporting an orderly transition to net zero, supporting our communities through colleague volunteering, which in turn has a positive impact on their wellbeing and engagement at work."

Nikki Ayrton, Charity Partner and Community Manager added: "By the end of 2023, we will have completed 1,000 volunteering hours and five events this year. The days are always fully booked and the feedback we get from colleagues is fantastic." As well as volunteering we also deliver events at the LBS offices in Leeds. This helps to connect staff with our partnership, educate them about climate and biodiversity and supports improved mental health and wellbeing in the workplace.

We provide regular reports and tailored content to demonstrate the impact of Leeds Building Society's support. Wendy said, "Having these figures, photos and case studies to hand is really helpful, providing evidence of our commitment to the environment to include in our Purpose Impact Report and Annual Report and Accounts. We also share regular updates with colleagues on our intranet to inspire them to take part. There is so much to be proud of."

Creating Darley Beck Wood

30 volunteers from five of our corporate partners came together with YDMT staff, the landowner and Milly the dog on a brisk February morning to create Darley Beck Wood in Nidderdale. 650 trees were planted, extending an existing mature bluebell woodland which will benefit wildlife and fauna by increasing available habitat and improving landscape connectivity. The newly planted trees will provide a place for shelter, food and dispersal, with hares, deer, barn owls, buzzards and many other woodland birds all present in the area.

The newly planted trees run parallel to a watercourse and will help improve soil run off and peak flows, which can prevent flooding. There is a public footpath running through the planting area, which is regularly used by locals and visiting walkers, allowing people to see this beautiful new woodland grow.

They also donate vital tools and materials that enable people to take action for nature in their own communities. A recent donation of supplies supported our community tree growing schemes – helping them to build seed germination trays to grow native tree saplings from seed.

The company has supported the planting of 2,000 trees in various locations across the Yorkshire Dales. Volunteering in the woodlands they have helped to create is a key partnership aim for JT Atkinson.

Managing Director Jamie Atkinson said: "A few times a year we invite colleagues from across the company to join us in the Dales to plant trees, remove plastic and maintain existing woodland. Not only are these volunteer days a great way for us to get away from our desks and get to know colleagues on a more personal level but they are fantastic at promoting our environmental values and inclusive culture."



"We invite all our new starters to come to a volunteering day and the feedback from staff is always very positive with most wanting to sign up for the next event. What is very rewarding is being able to revisit woodlands we've helped to establish and see the impact it is having on the wildlife and landscape."

JT Atkinson also take part in our annual fundraising appeals, matching donations made by individual supporters, meaning each donation literally has double the impact!


Illuminet Solutions

After discussions with other organisations, Illuminet Solutions, a consultancy firm in Poole, decided YDMT offered the best fit for their Environmental, Social and Governance objectives. So why did a business based in Dorset decide to support a small charity in the Yorkshire Dales?

Illuminet aspires to have a positive impact on the environment through the services and products they offer. Our partnership began in 2019 with the launch the company's 10th Anniversary Treevolution Initiative and has gone on to support the planting of 14,539 trees! As a small charity YDMT was able to offer a dedicated partnership manager and the flexible approach Illuminet was looking for.

Greg Wood, the company's founding CEO, said: "Since working with YDMT we have been inspired by their knowledge of the land, enthusiasm for trees and inspiring work on plastic free tree guards. We wanted a partner who really cared and wanted to make a difference. When you visit the Dales, you are stunned by the beauty of the region and how important our environment is to us all today and to the future."

Despite the distance, staff engagement plays a key role in the success of the partnership. We have developed ways to engage with the Illuminet team remotely, providing tailored training and materials to support their monthly eco-challenges - including litter picks, a composting challenge and biodiversity monitoring. Senior members of the Illuminet team recently joined us for a 'seeing is believing' event, where they helped plant the first of 2,040 trees in a new wildlife corridor. The project will help increase biodiversity, creating vital habitat for flora and fauna and connecting existing woodlands. We were able to give the team a behind-the-scenes look at how our projects are delivered and the way we collaborate with farmers and landowners to deliver positive social and environmental impacts.

Steve Farmer, Client Delivery Director, remembers, "We could see the scale of the project and could envisage how this will be a haven for birds, insects and small mammals in the future. A great example of partnership in action."
